



Eve Gruntfest- Biography

Eve Gruntfest is Professor Emerita of Geography and Environmental Studies at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs and a senior research at the Trauma, Health and Hazards Center there.

Dr. Gruntfest obtained her BA in Geography at Clark University and a MA and Ph.D. from the University of Colorado. She has been a visiting scientist at Joseph Fourier University in Grenoble, France (2010), the Cooperative Institute for Mesoscale Meteorological Studies in Norman, OK (2008-2011), the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder, CO (2005-2006) the University of Trieste, Italy and the Cooperative Institute for Research in the Atmosphere in Ft. Collins, CO (1999, 2000).

Her early research was on flash flood warning systems. Her recent efforts aim to build a community of early career people dedicated to problem solving at the intersection of weather and society, from the physical and social sciences.

Dr. Gruntfest has been an invited keynote speaker to many professional organizations in, and out, of the US including the Association of State Floodplain Managers, the National Weather Service, the US Army Corps of Engineers, the Hydrology Department at the University of Florence and the University of Ljubljana, the Australian Bureau of Meteorology, and the New Zealand Geologic and Nuclear Science group. She has been an invited expert at The Weather Channel and is featured in two flash flood documentaries.
